TRAINING CAMP NOTES

Camp roster

- The Senators 2017-18 camp roster includes 57 players: Six goaltenders, 18 defencemen and 33 forwards.
- Nineteen (19) players participated in the 2017 rookie camp and tournament in Ottawa and Toronto. The list of camp invitees is built primarily around the Senators' draft. Twenty-six (26) players were Ottawa selections in NHL drafts, 13 players were signed as free agents, 10 players were obtained in trades, three players are signed to American Hockey League contracts, three players are on professional tryouts and two players are on amateur tryouts, respectively.
- The Senators 2016-17 season training camp roster included 52 players: Five goaltenders, 17 defencemen and 30 forwards of which 24 players were selected by Ottawa in NHL drafts.

Rookie tournament

- The Senators participated in their 17th rookie camp and tournament from Sept. 7 to 10. This year's tournament was held in Toronto with the Montreal Canadiens and Toronto Maple Leafs also participating.
- The Senators won the tournament with a 2-0-0 record and earned at least two victories (of a maximum of three) for a ninth consecutive year; an 8-2 win over Montreal in the tournament's opener and a 4-3 shootout win over Toronto in the finale. The Senators rookies had trailed 3-0 in the third period before Maxime Lajoie ultimately scored the game-deciding goal in the shootout's sixth round.

41 – CRAIG ANDERSON, Goaltender – Catches: Left – **Size:** 6-2, 187 lbs. – **Born:** May 21, 1981 (Park Ridge, Ill.)
2016-17 Team: Ottawa (NHL) – **Draft:** 2001 - Chicago's third-round pick (73rd overall) – **Acquired:** Traded from Colorado in exchange for Brian Elliott on 2/18/11

2016-17: Reached the 25-win plateau for the third time in four seasons despite missing more than 30 regular season games due to personal reasons after his wife was diagnosed with cancer in late October ... Recorded back-to-back shutouts for the third time in his career on Oct. 25 at Vancouver (3-0 win) and on Oct. 30 at Edmonton (2-0 win) where he made an emotional return to the team to post what was the first shutout in Rogers Place history (37 saves) ... Was recognized as the NHL's First Star of the Week on three occasions (Oct. 31, Nov. 28 and April 10) ... Surpassed Patrick Lalime to move into first place among all-time Senators goaltenders in wins (147) on March 11 at Colorado (4-2 win) ... Became only the sixth American to appear in a 500th NHL game as a goaltender on March 25 at Montreal (3-1 loss) ... Was selected by the Professional Hockey Writers Association (PHWA) as the Senators' nominee for the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy, an award he won at the NHL Awards in June, becoming the first Senator to do so ... In conjunction with Mike Condon, became the first pair of franchise goaltenders to each record at least five shutouts in one season while matching the franchise best (10) that was established in 2001-02 ... Moved into a tie for the franchise lead with his 21st post-season victory in Game 6 of the team's Eastern Conference Final series vs. Pittsburgh on May 23 (2-1 win). The victory also saw him become the first goaltender in the NHL expansion era (1968 onwards) with multiple 45-save wins in playoff games in which his team faced elimination ... Started each of Ottawa's 19 playoff games.

2016-17: Began the season with Montreal (NHL) before being claimed on waivers by Pittsburgh (NHL) on Oct. 11 ... Played in one game with the Penguins, appearing in 20 minutes of relief on Oct. 22 in a 5-1 loss at Nashville ... Was acquired by Ottawa (NHL) on Nov. 2 ... Earned the first win (27 saves) and first shutout of his Senators career in making his Ottawa debut on Nov. 3 vs. Vancouver (1-0 win) ... Established new NHL career highs in goals-against-average (2.48), save percentage (.914) and shutouts (five) ... Earned a record of 11-3-2 over games in which he faced 30 or more shots ... Set a new career high when he made 42 saves (while matching a career high in facing 42 shots) in recording his third shutout of the season on Jan. 19 at Columbus (2-0 win) ...
