The transaction ultimately saw the Senators acquire centre Matt Duchene from Colorado. The Senators acquired Columbus’ first-round pick as part of a trade package which sent Duchene and Julius Bergman to the Blue Jackets in exchange for Vitaly Abramov, Jonathan Davidsson and this pick on Feb. 22, 2019. The Senators have yet to select with the 19th pick of an NHL Draft in team history.
2	32	The Senators have yet to select with the 32nd pick of an NHL Draft in team history.
2	44 (from Florida via San Jose)	The Senators acquired this selection from San Jose (the Sharks had originally obtained the pick as part of a trade with Florida, primarily in exchange for former Senator Mike Hoffman, on June 19, 2018), as part of the trade that saw Ottawa acquire Rudolfs Balcers, Dylan DeMelo, Josh Norris and Chris Tierney in exchange for Erik Karlsson and Francis Perron on Sept. 13, 2018. The Senators drafted Mike Fisher with the 44th selection in 1998.
3	83 (from Pittsburgh)	The Senators original third-round pick (64th overall) belongs to Colorado after it was acquired by the Avalanche as part of a three-way trade (which also included Nashville -- details denoted above) on Nov. 5, 2017. The transaction primarily saw Ottawa acquire Filip Gustavsson and a first-round selection in 2018 (which was later traded to New York in exchange for the Rangers’ first-round selection in 2018 -- Jacob Bernard-Docker) in exchange for Derick Brassard and Vincent Dunn. The Senators have yet to select with the 83rd pick of an NHL Draft in team history.

Ottawa Senators draft notes

Draft summary: The Senators have drafted a total of 219 players since 1992. The team has not had a first-round selection on two occasions (2010 and 2014). Ottawa traded its first-round pick (16th overall) in 2010 to St. Louis in exchange for David Rundblad. On Dec. 17, 2011, the Senators traded Rundblad and their second-round selection in 2012 to the Phoenix Coyotes in exchange for Kyle Turris. The Senators traded their first-round pick in 2014 to the Anaheim Ducks (along with Stefan Noesen and Jakob Silfverberg) in exchange for Bobby Ryan on July 5, 2013. The team traded its first-round pick in 2019 to the Colorado Avalanche (along with Shane Bowers, Andrew Hammond, Turris and the team's third-round pick in 2019) in exchange for Matt Duchene on Nov. 5, 2017. The Senators recouped a 2019 first-round selection (from the Columbus Blue Jackets) as part of a trade package which included Duchene on Feb. 22, 2019.

Position breakdown: Ottawa's 219 picks are composed of 22 goaltenders, 78 defencemen, 44 centres, 38 left wingers and 37 right wingers.

In the Senators organization: As of June 20, thirty-five (35) of the Senators all-time draft picks remain within the organization as either a prospect or roster player.

The Senators yesterday and today: Three hundred and seventy (370) players have played at least one game for Ottawa since the 1992-93 season, 92 of which were drafted by the Senators – nine goaltenders, 27 defencemen, 25 centres, 14 left wingers and 17 right wingers.

First class: Twenty-three (23) of Ottawa's 30 first-round selections have played for the Senators, including current organizational roster players Logan Brown (2016), Cody Ceci (2012), Thomas Chabot (2015), Brady Tkachuk (2018) and Colin White (2015) while five others have played with other NHL teams; Bryan Berard (1995 – NYI, TOR, NYR, BOS, CHI and CBJ), Mathieu Chouinard (1998 – LA), Tim Gleason (2001 – LA, CAR and TOR), Jakub Klepis (2002 – WSH) and Stefan Noesen (2011 – ANA, NJ). The Senators have selected first-overall on three occasions: Alexandre Daigle (1993), Berard (1995) and Chris Phillips (1996).

Draft picks and NHL experience: A total of 109 (which includes Chouinard twice) drafted players (13 goaltenders, 33 defencemen, 28 centres, 15 left wingers and 20 right wingers) selected by the Senators since 1992 have played at least one game in the NHL. Thirty-nine (39) of the Senators' picks have only played for Ottawa. Fifty-three (53) draft picks have played for both Ottawa and another NHL team(s). Seventeen (17) picks have played in the NHL but not for Ottawa.

NHL experience per round: Ottawa's first-, second-, third- and fourth-round picks have produced the most NHL players for the club: 1st-round – 28* NHLers; 2nd – 17*; 3rd – 13; 4th – 17; 5th – 9; 6th – 7; 7th – 7; 8th – 2; 9th – 7; 10th – 0; 11th – 2. *Chouinard was drafted twice by Ottawa – in the first (1998) and second (2000) rounds.

Picked to play in the NHL: Fifteen (15) draft picks have played at least one NHL game in the season immediately following their respective draft year. Tomas Jelinek (1992) was the first. Other players include: Radek Hamr (1992), Alexandre Daigle (1993), Pavol Demitra (1993), Radek Bonk (1994), Stan Neckar (1994), Andreas Dackell (1996), Marian Hossa (1997), Magnus Arvedsson (1997), Toni Dahlman (2001), Zack Smith (2008), Jared Cowen (2009), Mika Zibanejad (2011), Alex Formenton (2017) and Brady Tkachuk (2018). Jelinek, Ottawa's second last pick of the 1992 draft in the 11th round, dressed for the Senators' return to the NHL on Oct. 8, 1992 -- a 5-3 home win over Montreal.

Time for development: While 115 draft picks have never played in the NHL, or have yet to dress, three players have taken six years to reach the Senators and the NHL, six players took five seasons and an additional eight players required four years. Roman Wick (2004), Eric Gryba (2006) and Chris Wideman (2009) took six years from their respective drafts to play an NHL game with Ottawa. Julien Vauclair (1998), Colin Greening (2005), Fredrik Claesson (2011), Ryan Dzingel (2011), Max McCormick (2011) and Marcus Hogberg (2013) required five years from their respective drafts to reach the NHL. The four-year players include: Josh Langfeld (1997), Chris Kelly (1999), Brandon Bochenski (2001), Alexei Kaigorodov (2002), Brian Elliott (2003), Peter Regin (2004), Erik Condra (2006) and Derek Grant (2008).

Diamonds in the rough: The Senators have seen seven players selected in the now defunct ninth-round go on to play in the NHL. There were also two players who were selected in the 11th-round that went on to play for Ottawa (Tomas Jelinek and Antti Tormanen). Some notable late round picks by the Senators include: Daniel Alfredsson (1994, 6th-round, 133rd overall), Erik Condra (2006, 7th-round, 211th overall), Andreas Dackell (1996, 6th-round, 136th overall), Pavol Demitra (1993, 9th-round, 227th overall), Ryan Dzingel (2011, 7th-round, 204th overall), Brian Elliott (2003, 9th round, 291st overall), Colin Greening (2005, 7th-round, 204th overall), Brooks Laich (2001, 6th-round, 193rd overall), Chris Neil (1998, 6th-round, 161st overall), Martin Prusek (1999, 6th-round, 164th overall), Karel Rachunek (1997, 9th-round, 229th overall), Sami Salo (1996, 9th-round, 239th overall) and Mark Stone (2010, 6th-round, 178th overall). Elliott's NHL debut on Oct. 10, 2007, saw him become the lowest drafted player to ever play for the Senators.

1995 the lone empty draft: The only year which none of the Senators draft picks ultimately played at least one game for Ottawa is 1995, but four of the team's nine draftees that year did play in the NHL. Ottawa's first overall pick in 1995, Bryan Berard, was traded in a deal that included the return of the second overall pick, Wade Redden, from the N.Y. Islanders, on Jan. 23, 1996. Redden went on to play 838 games for the Senators, which ranks fourth in franchise history.

Stanley Cup winners: Four Senators draft picks have won the Stanley Cup. Stan Neckar (29th, 1994) won with Tampa Bay in 2004, Marian Hossa (12th, 1997) won with Chicago in 2010, 2013 and 2015, Chris Kelly (94th, 1999) won with Boston in 2011 and Antoine Vermette (55th, 2000) won with Chicago in 2015.

June 29, 1994: Sean Hill was acquired from Anaheim with the Mighty Ducks' ninth-round pick in 1994 (210th overall) in exchange for the Senators' third-round pick in 1994 (later traded to Tampa Bay). Ottawa selected Frédéric Cassivi with the 210th-overall pick.

June 22, 1996: Shawn McEachern was acquired from Boston in exchange for Trent McCleary and Ottawa's third-round pick in 1996 (53rd overall, Eric Naud).

June 27, 1998: Sergei Verenikin was selected by Ottawa in the eighth-round (223rd overall) of the 1998 draft. The pick was obtained from San Jose in exchange for Ottawa's eighth-round selection in 1999 (241st overall, Douglas Murray).

June 26, 1999: Ottawa traded the N.Y. Rangers' second-round pick in 1999 (previously acquired, 44th overall, Jordan Leopold) to Anaheim in exchange for the Mighty Ducks' second-round pick in 1999 (48th overall) and the their seventh-round pick in 1999 (201st overall). Ottawa selected Simon Lajeunesse with the 48th pick and Mikko Ruutu with the 201st selection.

June 25, 2000: Los Angeles traded its fifth-round pick (156th overall) and fifth-round compensatory pick (157th overall) in 2000 to Ottawa in exchange for the Senators' fourth-round pick (118th overall, Lubomir Visnovsky) in 2000. Ottawa selected Greg Zanon 156th overall and Grant Potulny with the 157th pick.

June 25, 2000: Shane Hnidy was acquired from Detroit in exchange for Ottawa's eighth-round pick (251st overall, Todd Jackson) in the 2000 draft.

June 23, 2001: Zdeno Chara and Bill Muckalt were acquired from the N.Y. Islanders along with their first-round pick (second overall), in the 2001 draft in exchange for Alexei Yashin. Ottawa selected Jason Spezza with the second pick.

June 23, 2001: Philadelphia traded its first-round pick in 2001 (23rd overall) to Ottawa for the Senators' first-round pick (27th overall, Jeff Woywitka) and seventh-round pick (225th overall, David Printz) in 2001 and (previously acquired) Tampa Bay's second-round selection in 2002 which was later traded to Dallas (34th overall, Tobias Stephan). Ottawa selected Tim Gleason with the 23rd pick.

- June 23, 2001:** Ottawa traded its second-round pick in 2001 (60th overall, Victor Uchevatov) to New Jersey in exchange for the Devils' third-round compensatory pick (81st overall) and third-round pick (94th overall – the pick was later traded to Tampa Bay) in 2001. Ottawa selected Neil Komadoski with the 81st selection.
- June 23, 2001:** Ottawa traded New Jersey's third-round pick in 2001 (previously acquired, 94th overall, Evgeny Artyukhin) to Tampa Bay in exchange for the Lightning's fourth-round pick (99th overall) and Buffalo's seventh-round pick (previously acquired, 218th overall) in 2001. Ottawa selected Ray Emery with the 99th selection and Jan Platil with the 218th pick.
- June 24, 2001:** Montreal traded its eighth-round pick in 2001 (235th overall) to Ottawa in exchange for Andreas Dackell. Ottawa selected Neil Petruic with the 235th pick.
- June 22, 2002:** N.Y. Rangers traded their third-round pick in 2002 (75th overall) to Ottawa for Ottawa's third-round pick (81st overall, Marcus Jonassen) and fourth-round compensatory pick (127th overall, Nate Guenin) in 2002. Ottawa selected Arttu Luttinen with the 75th selection.
- June 23, 2002:** Josef Boumedienne was acquired from Tampa Bay in exchange for Ottawa's seventh-round pick (213th overall, Fredrik Norrena) in 2002.
- June 22, 2003:** Ottawa traded Washington's ninth-round pick (previously acquired, 279th overall, Mark Olafson) in 2003 to Washington for future considerations.
- June 26, 2004:** Shawn Weller was selected by Ottawa in the third-round (77th overall) in 2004. The pick was originally obtained from Los Angeles in exchange for Radek Bonk.
- June 27, 2004:** Patrick Lalime was traded to St. Louis in exchange for a conditional fourth-round pick in 2005. Ottawa selected Ilya Zubov with the 98th selection in 2005.
- July 30, 2005:** Ottawa traded the rights to Todd White to Minnesota in exchange for Colorado's fourth-round pick in 2005 (previously acquired by the Wild, 95th overall). Ottawa selected Cody Bass with the 95th selection.
- June 23, 2007:** Ottawa acquired Tampa Bay's fourth-round pick in 2008 (previously acquired from Dallas) in exchange for the Senators' fifth-round pick (150th overall, Matt Marshall), Phoenix's seventh-round pick in 2007 (previously acquired, 183rd overall, Torrie Jung) and Ottawa's seventh-round pick in 2007 (210th overall, Justin Courtnall). Ottawa selected Derek Grant with the 119th selection in 2008.
- June 20, 2008:** Ottawa acquired Nashville's 2008 first-round pick (15th overall) in exchange for the Senators' 2008 first-round pick (18th overall, Chet Pickard) and their third-round pick in 2009 (70th overall, Taylor Beck). Ottawa selected Erik Karlsson with the 15th selection.
- June 27, 2009:** Ottawa acquired Edmonton's 2009 seventh-round pick (191st overall) in exchange for the Senators' 2010 sixth-round pick (166th overall, Drew Czerwonka). Ottawa selected Michael Sdao with the 191st selection.
