### Capitals Prospects Showcase Notes

The Washington Capitals will compete in a four-team prospect showcase to be held at Ford Ice Center in Antioch, Tenn., from Sept. 7-10. The 2019 Prospects Showcase will also feature top prospects from the Nashville Predators, the Tampa Bay Lightning and the Carolina Hurricanes. Capitals prospects will face each team once in the round robin showcase.

The Capitals' tournament roster includes prospects who are under contract and recent Capitals draft picks who have not been signed yet. In addition, several undrafted and free agent amateur players will participate. Each game will feature three 20 minute periods, followed by a shootout, regardless of the score. Video of each game will be lived streamed by visiting [WashingtonCaps.com](http://WashingtonCaps.com), as well as audio only broadcasts on Caps Radio 24/7. The Capitals will also hold practice on Sept. 6 and 9, both at 11 a.m.

### Player Bios

	<p><b>Alexander Alexeyev</b> Defenseman (27) Drafted by WSH in the first round, 31<sup>st</sup> overall, in the 2018 NHL Draft</p> <p>Alexeyev registered 43 points (10g, 33a) in 49 games for the Red Deer Rebels in the WHL. Alexeyev was named the Player of the Week from Oct. 22 to Oct. 28 after recording eight points (3g, 5a) in four games and was named the Red Deer Advocate Male Athlete of the Year in March, an award that recognizes amateur athletes for their success in sports. Additionally, the Capitals' 2018 first round selection (31<sup>st</sup> overall) helped Team Russia win a bronze medal in the World Junior Championship, recording six points (2g, 4a) in seven games.</p>
	<p><b>Kristofers Bindulis</b> Defenseman (84) Signed with WSH as a Free Agent on March 7, 2017</p> <p>Bindulis played in four games for the Hershey Bears during the 2018-19 season before missing the remainder of the season with an upper body injury. During the 2017-18 season, Bindulis appeared in 12 games for the Bears, recording an assist, and 34 games for the South Carolina Stingrays in the ECHL, recording 15 points (4g, 11a).</p>
	<p><b>Kody Clark</b> Right Wing (71) Drafted by WSH in the second round, 47<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2018 NHL Draft</p> <p>Clark appeared in 57 games for the Ottawa 67's in the OHL last season, recording 46 points (17g, 29a). Clark added another 14 points (5g, 9a) in 18 playoff games. Clark is the son of Wendel Clark, who was drafted first overall in the 1985 NHL Draft by the Toronto Maple Leafs and amassed 564 points (330g, 234a) in 793 games between the Maple Leafs, the Quebec Nordiques, the Detroit Red Wings, the Tampa Bay Lightning and the Chicago Blackhawks.</p>
	<p><b>Martin Fehervary</b> Defenseman (42) Drafted by WSH in the second round, 46<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2018 NHL Draft</p> <p>Fehervary registered seven points (1g, 6a) for HV-71 in the Swedish Hockey League in 45 games during the 2018-2019 season. Fehervary also captained Team Slovakia during the World Junior Championship, recording five points (1g, 4a) in five games. He was named a top three player on Slovakia during the tournament. Additionally, Fehervary represented Slovakia during the 2019 IIHF World Championship, recording an assist in seven games.</p>
	<p><b>Eric Florchuk</b> Center (58) Drafted by WSH in the seventh round, 217<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2018 NHL Draft</p> <p>Florchuk recorded 50 points (21g, 29a) in 68 games with the Saskatoon Blades in the WHL. The Fort Saskatchewan, Alta., native ranked fourth on the Blades in goals and fifth in points.</p>

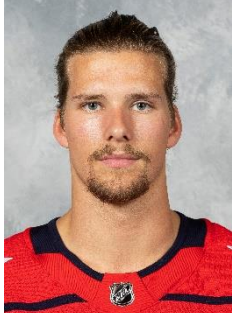
**Tobias Geisser**  
Defenseman (46)  
Drafted by WSH in the fourth round, 120<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2017 NHL Draft

Geisser played in 41 games last season for the Hershey Bears in the AHL, recording an assist. The defenseman from Stans, Switzerland, was named to Team Switzerland for the 2019 World Junior Championship, the second time he had been named to Switzerland's World Junior team (2018). In 2018, he was named as one of the top three players for Switzerland.



**Shane Gersich**  
Left Wing (63)  
Drafted by WSH in the fifth round, 134<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2014 NHL Draft

Gersich recorded 24 points (8g, 16a) in 66 games in his first professional season with the Hershey Bears last season. Gersich added another three points (1g, 2a) in nine playoff games with the Bears. He led Bears rookies in power play goals (2) and ranked second in points per game (0.36) among Hershey rookies with at least 10 games played.



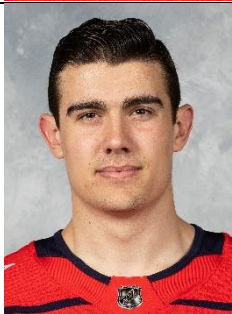
**Axel Jonsson-Fjallby**  
Left Wing (45)  
Drafted by WSH in the fifth round, 147<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2016 NHL Draft

Jonsson-Fjallby played in 16 games with the Hershey Bears last season, recording three points (2g, 1a). Jonsson-Fjallby was loaned to Djurgardens IF in the Swedish Hockey League on Nov. 13, 2018, where he recorded 10 points (1g, 9a) in 36 games in the SHL.



**Alex Kannok-Leipert**  
Defenseman (53)  
Drafted by WSH in the sixth round, 161<sup>st</sup> overall, in the 2018 NHL Draft

Kannok-Leipert recorded 19 points (5g, 14a) and 93 penalty minutes in 67 games for the Vancouver Giants of the WHL. Kannok-Leipert added another 12 points (2g, 10a) in 22 playoff games, helping Vancouver reach the WHL Final.



**Brett Leason**  
Right Wing (49)  
Drafted by WSH in the second round, 56<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2019 NHL Draft

Leason registered 89 points (36g, 53a) in 55 games with the Prince Albert Raiders of the Western Hockey League (WHL) last season, where he led them in points and ranked eighth in the WHL. Additionally, Leason received the E.J. McGuire Award of Excellence this year, presented annually by the NHL to a prospect who best exemplifies commitment to excellence through strength of character, competitiveness and athleticism.

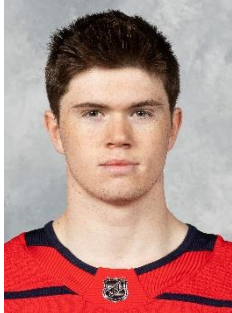


**Beck Malenstyn**

Left Wing (47)

Drafted by WSH in the fifth round, 145<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2016 NHL Draft

Malenstyn recorded 16 points (7g, 9a) in 74 games with the Hershey Bears last season. Malenstyn ranked third among first year players on the Bears in points and shots.



**Connor McMichael**

Center (24)

Drafted by WSH in the first round, 25<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2019 NHL Draft

McMichael spent the 2018-19 season with the London Knights of the Ontario Hockey League (OHL). He ranked second on London with 72 points (36g, 36a) in 67 games and recorded five points (2g, 3a) in 11 playoff games. McMichael was selected for Team Canada's Development Camp this summer.



**Bobby Nardella**

Defenseman (88)

Signed with WSH as a free agent on April 5, 2019

Nardella played in 38 games for The University of Notre Dame in the NCAA, recording 34 points (8g, 26a). Nardella became the first defenseman to lead Notre Dame in points in the program's history. He was named to the Big 10 First All-Star Team and was a Hobey Baker Award nominee. Additionally, Nardella made his debut with the Hershey Bears last season, playing in two games.



**Garrett Pilon**

Center (40)

Drafted by WSH in the third round, 87<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2016 NHL Draft

Pilon led first year players on the Hershey Bears with 33 points (10g, 23a) in 71 games and was tied for fourth in assists. Pilon is the son of Rich Pilon, who recorded 77 points (8g, 69a) in 631 career games between the New York Islanders, New York Rangers and St. Louis Blues.



**Brian Pinho**

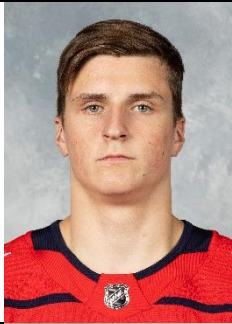
Center (64)

Drafted by WSH in the sixth round, 174<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2013 NHL Draft

Pinho recorded 12 points (4g, 8a) in 73 games in his first season with the Hershey Bears last season. Pinho scored the series-clinching overtime goal against the Bridgeport Sound Tigers in Game 5 to advance the Bears to the second round.

**Aliaksei Protas**  
 Center (59)  
 Drafted by WSH in the third round, 91<sup>st</sup> overall, in the 2019 NHL Draft

Protas registered 40 points (11g, 29a) in 61 games with Prince Albert in the WHL last season. He ranked seventh among WHL rookies in points and he led all WHL rookies in playoff points with 22 (12g, 10a) in 23 games. Protas is the first player the Capitals have drafted from Belarus.



**Kristian Roykas Marthinsen**  
 Left Wing (51)  
 Drafted by WSH in the seventh round, 213<sup>th</sup> overall, in the 2017 NHL Draft

Marthinsen recorded 29 points (13g, 16a) in 62 games with the Saskatoon Blades in the WHL. Marthinsen also recorded two goals in five games for Team Norway at the D1A World Junior Championship, earning a bronze medal.



**Ilya Samsonov**  
 Goalie (30)  
 Drafted by WSH in the first round, 22<sup>nd</sup> overall, in the 2015 NHL Draft

Samsonov finished his first professional season in North America with a 20-14-2 record, a 2.70 goals against average and a .898 save percentage in 37 games with Hershey in the AHL. Samsonov tied for eighth in the AHL in shutouts (3) and won six consecutive games from Feb. 2 to Feb. 27, posting a 1.46 goals against average and a .947 save percentage in that span. Additionally, Samsonov appeared in five playoff games with Hershey, finishing with a 2-3-0 record, a 2.99 goals against average and a .897 save percentage.



**Joe Snively**  
 Right Wing (91)  
 Signed with WSH as a free agent on March 18, 2019

Originally from Herndon, Va., Snively recorded seven points (2g, 5a) in nine games with the Hershey Bears last season. Prior to Hershey, Snively recorded 36 points (15g, 21a) in 33 games with Yale University in the ECAC and was named to the ECAC's First All-Star Team. He led Yale in points in all four years of his attendance and recorded 139 points (58g, 81a) in 129 career NCAA games. Snively was named as a Hobey Baker Award nominee this season.







**Riley Sutter**  
 Center (67)  
 Drafted by WSH in the third round, 93<sup>rd</sup> overall, in the 2018 NHL Draft

Sutter recorded 41 points (14g, 27a) in 38 games for the Everett Silvertips in the WHL, ranking sixth on Everett in points despite missing 30 games due to injury. Sutter is the son of Ron Sutter, who was drafted fourth overall in 1982 by the Philadelphia Flyers and amassed 535 points (205g, 330a) in 1,093 games between the Philadelphia Flyers, the St. Louis Blues, the Quebec Nordiques, the New York Islanders, the Boston Bruins, the San Jose Sharks and the Calgary Flames. Additionally, Sutter has five uncles who played in the NHL (Darryl, Duane, Brian, Rich and Brent Sutter).

	<p><b>Logan Thompson</b> Goaltender (35) Signed by Hershey as a free agent on May 21, 2019</p> <p>Thompson finished with a 18-6-0 record, a 2.22 goals against average and a .934 save percentage at Brock University in the Ontario University Athletics, ranking second and third in save percentage and goals against average, respectively, in the OUA in the 2018-19 season. Thompson was named to the All-Rookie Team, the First All-Star Team, the Rookie of Year and the Goaltender of the Year in the OUA West.</p>
	<p><b>Mitchell Vanderlaan</b> Left Wing (81) Free Agent invitee</p> <p>Vanderlaan skated in two games with Utica in the AHL last season. Prior to Utica, Vanderlaan recorded 30 points (11g, 19a) in 36 games with Cornell University in the NCAA, where he ranked second on the team in points. Additionally, Vanderlaan was named an All-Ivy League Honorable Mention and won the Bill Doran Sportsmanship Award, presented to the Cornell player combining all the best attributes in sportsmanship, both on and off the ice, as well as being an excellent competitive player.</p>
	<p><b>Sebastian Walfridsson</b> Defenseman (48) Drafted by WSH in the fifth round, 151st overall, in the 2017 NHL Draft</p> <p>Walfridsson recorded two assists in 22 games with MODO Hockey in the Swedish Hockey League, and another 11 points (4g, 7a) in 24 games with the junior MODO Hockey team. Walfridsson earned a gold medal with the MODO Hockey junior team.</p>
	<p><b>Beck Warm</b> Goaltender (60) Free Agent invitee</p> <p>Warm finished with a 32-23-5 record, a 2.94 goals against average and a .916 save percentage with the Tri-City Americans in the WHL. Warm ranked third in both wins and save percentage among goaltenders with at least 50 games in the WHL and was named to the WHL (West) Second All-Star Team.</p>
